What is the purpose of this study?

The purpose of the study is to investigate cybersecurity in the Australian Agricultural sector from the perspective of people working in the sector. We are interested in people's experiences and opinions on what is currently working well and challenges facing the sector as farming businesses incorporate digital technologies into their practices.

Why have I been invited to participate in this study?

We are seeking the input of farmers and other stakeholders in the agricultural sector in Australia to provide their insights about their digital technology and cyber practices. We are interested in the insights of those working at different scales of farming, using different production systems from all around Australia, and farming businesses using different amounts and types of technology, as well as a range of organisations involved in providing services to Australian farmers and other primary producers. We want to gain an understanding of how best to support the Australian farming sector through future cyber security research and other initiatives.

What does this study involve?

The study will involve participation in an interview. Farmers and other primary producers will be asked about their business, farming practices, and use of a range of technology, including aspects of privacy and security. Other stakeholders will be asked about their perceptions of farmer's use of technology. The interview will take about 60 to 90 minutes and can be conducted either on the phone or via Zoom (or a similar video conferencing platform).

With your permission, the interview will be audio-recorded and transcribed. You will be given the opportunity to review your transcript once it is completed and will have one week from when the transcript is emailed to you to change, retract, or offer additional comments to the original interview.

What are the risks and benefits of participating in the study?

Aside from giving up your time, there are no foreseeable risks associated with participating in this study. Your participation will increase our understanding of people's experiences and opinions on what is currently working well and challenges facing the sector as farming businesses incorporate digital technologies into their practices. Participants will be provided with a \$100 gift voucher for participating in the study.

Who is funding this study?

The research is funded by the Cyber Security Cooperative Research Centre (CSCRC) with in kind contributions from Charles Sturt University, CSIRO's Data61 and Queensland University.

What if I don't want to take part in this study?

Participation is voluntary. You do not have to take part in the study. Your decision whether to participate will not affect your current or future relationship with the researchers or anyone else at the participating organisations. If you decide to participate, you can change your mind at any stage before or during the interview. If any topic is raised during the interview that you prefer not to discuss, you only need to tell the interviewer and the topic will not be pursued. There will be no negative consequences if you decide not to participate, withdraw your consent, or refuse to answer questions.

What if I wish to withdraw my data after the interview?

As mentioned above, you will have the opportunity to review and amend your transcript after the interview. After this point, your transcript will be deidentified and added to a pool of data. We will not be able to remove your data after this point.

How will my confidentiality be protected?

All information provided by you will be treated confidentially. Your name, workplace or any other personal information will not be included in any publications resulting from the study. All data collected in this study will be reported in such a way that responses will not be able to be linked to any individuals. Although interviews may be recorded and analysed by a researcher, the recordings will only be available to our research team. De-identified, non-sensitive data collected by the project may be shared with other researchers for the purposes of verifying published results or advancing other research on this topic. Any quotes we use from your interview as part of our presentation of results will be completely de-identified. Any data collected as part of this study will be securely stored as per CSIRO's Recordkeeping Procedure.

What will happen to the information that I give you?

The information collected will be analysed to produce a report for the CSCRC and one or more academic papers. We will give you the option of receiving a summary of the study results after the project has been completed.
