ment of Water and the Avon Valley Environmental Society (AVES).

The students experienced many activities that would otherwise not have been possible. They went to Mt Ommaney, Mt Stirling, the Kep Trail, Dorntj Koorliny trail, and the Avon River, as well as Karakamia, Scitech, Ecoeducation Centre Mundaring and the Gingin Discovery Centre.

At Mt Ommaney and Mt Stirling the students were in volved in flora and fauna surveys and water testing with the assistance of Peter Weatherly from AVES.

The students also had guest speakers from Wheatbelt NRM, ecoscientists such as frog scientists, AVES, the Department of Water and elders from the Aboriginal community.

Students were also involved in a cleanup of Mt Ommaney, picking up litter. Funds also were used to purchase water testing equipment and support resources

for the environmental studies.
