The Koorda Community Resource Centre (CRC) worked in conjunction with the Koorda Primary School to raise awareness of salinity and soil conditions, water pH, varieties of vegetation that are suited to Koorda through information sessions at the

Koorda is a drought affected area and the trees planted in the past year have had a very low survival rate. The school replanted trees that forms the
