

Revegetating Tributaries York District



The Talbot Brook Land Management Association Inc (TBLMA) is an active catchment group in the Shire of York. In 2011 they applied to Wheatbelt NRM for a Small Community Grant to assist in the planting of 40,000 native seedlings to revegetate sections of 6 Mile Creek and Boyanning Creek over three properties, by buying three tree planters. The purpose of the revegetation was to:

- increase the biodiversity of the creeklines
- to endeavour to filter nutrients, fertilisers, surfactants and herbicides from entering the Avon River system
- to stabilise sediments and tributary banks, preventing further erosion
- to create wildlife corridors for birds and other large fauna

- to re-establish native flora with protective fencing, to prevent stock intrusion.

Other groups involved in planting included Department of Water, Northam; The Swan River Trust; Emmanuel Catholic College, Beeliar; Rostrata Primary School, Willetton; and University of WA Landscape & Design Students.
